January 22, through February 26, 2019

January 22, 2019 – Residential Burglary – 30000 block of Oriente Drive – Unknown suspect broke into the victim's storage shed and took misc. tools. No suspect info at this time, case still under investigation.

January 23, 2019 – Grand theft – 48000 block of Center Road – Unknown suspect took diesel fuel and batteries from the parked construction equipment. Ongoing theft from this location, no leads at this time.

January 25, 2019 – Recovered Stolen Vehicle – 46000 block of Derwent Road – A search warrant was served in reference to narcotics activity at the residence. During a search of the property, two stolen vehicles were recovered along with narcotics.

January 30, 2019 – Recovered Stolen Vehicle – Bragdon Road / Sonoma Road – A stolen semitruck and trailer loaded with propane tanks was stolen from the Lenwood area and tracked to this location. Several propane tanks were taken from the truck by unknown suspects. No additional leads at this time.

February 3, 2019 – Residential Burglary – 42000 block of Coventry Road – Unknown suspect(s) entered the residence and took firearms and a safe. No additional leads at this time, ongoing investigation.

February 19, 2019 – Recovered Stolen Property – Newberry Springs area – A box truck loaded with commercial grade TV studio equipment was stolen from the Lenwood area and ultimately recovered by the CHP in the Newberry Springs area empty. Deputies from the Barstow Station

continued the investigation into the location of the studio equipment. After several hours of investigation and the service of three search warrants, the studio equipment, valued at \$1.3 million dollars was recovered in the Harvard and Newberry Springs area. Suspects Daniel Lynch, Patrick Zozaya, Kelcy Otani and Robert Lee, all of Newberry Springs were arrested.

February 23, 2019 – Terrorist Threats – Bagdad Café – Brian Reyna was at the Bagdad Café causing a disturbance inside. He allegedly vandalized the inside of the café and made threats to people inside. He fled the café prior to deputies arriving. Reyna was contacted at the Circle K on Fort Cady Road and was arrested.

February 26, 2019 – Residential Burglary – 35000 block of Johil Road – Suspect(s) broke into a storage shed on the property and took misc. property from inside. No suspect leads at this time, ongoing investigation.
